RUOK? Day

Annually Finley High School supports the RUOK? Day campaign. On Thursday 12th September we encouraged all staff and students to accessorise with something yellow, join in lunchtime activities and if you're worried about someone to ask them if they are ok. RUOK? Day came about after Gavin Larkin lost his father to suicide. To make change Australia-wide, a national campaign was formed and with Gavin's expertise and passion, R U OK? was born. RUOK? Day has been a national campaign since 2009. R U OK?'s vision is a world where we're all connected and are protected from suicide. Their mission is to inspire and empower everyone to meaningfully connect with people around them and support anyone struggling with life. Their goals are to:

- 1. Boost our confidence to meaningfully connect and ask about life's ups and downs
- 2. Nurture our sense of responsibility to regularly connect and support others
- 3. Strengthen our sense of belonging because we know people are there for us
- 4. Be relevant, strong and dynamic

It is normal to have moments when you might not feel yourself but when symptoms are prolonged or start affecting your relationships and behaviour it could be a sign that you are not okay and it might help to talk to someone. If you recognise changes in your friend's behaviour and moods, it is worth starting the conversation. To do this RUOK? suggests asking the question, listening to the answer, encouraging action and checking in. It might be that they just need to vent about something or that they really do need to seek professional help. Sometimes we are scared to ask the question because we do not know how we will react to the response. It is important to put aside those fears and let your friends know that you support them. Remember to look after yourself too, if your friend is really struggling and you are not sure if you can help then encourage them to seek professional support such as talking to a trusted adult, online or face to face counselling or their GP. Although RUOK? Day encourages starting the conversation just this one day a year, it is to raise awareness and give confidence for you to ask all year around.
