Safe Enclosed Leather Footwear

All students studying practical subjects have been issued with information by their teachers with regards to our Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) requirements for practical subjects, especially shoes.

We have attached the shoe policy again in this newsletter for parents who will be buying safe shoes in the future.

It has come to our notice that parents are buying shoes for their sons/daughters that are leather or nubuck leather on the outside. However the tongue of the shoe is not leather but a soft padded fabric covered tongue. We cannot accept a soft fabric tongue under the required guidelines.

We ask that parents/carers are most careful when buying the safe shoes that this soft tongue is not in the shoe. The tongue must be leather. Globe shoes are not appropriate footwear as they have a soft tongue and should not be purchased for school in the future.

On Australia Day 2010 the Finley High School Show Team was delighted to be awarded the Berrigan Shire "Team or Organisation of the Year". It was impressive to witness the awards and to listen to the achievements of the large numbers of people and organisations that received nominations.





Facility Upgrades

This year is a significant year for Science at Finley High School. The Science block that was constructed in 1973 has received an upgrade that has resulted in new Science laboratories that meet all current industry standards. Students will benefit from more versatile laboratories with state of the art fixtures and access to up to date technologies. Finley High School has been fortunate enough to receive similar upgrades with the new Industrial Technologies building and the soon to be constructed Hospitalities commercial kitchen.

As part of the upgrade, the Laboratories, Industrial Technology building and Kitchens have been equipped with "worksafe" status and the relevant signage. This covers these areas with the appropriate worksafe legislation for the protection of all students and staff that work within these areas. One of the requirements to be able to work within these facilities is approved footwear. At Finley High School this is enclosed, black, water resistant shoes. Examples of these shoes are being worn by some of our current Year Seven students.

MAX Potential

Mentors needed for Student Leadership Program

What is Max Potential?

The Max Potential project offers 22 weeks of personal leadership development, including coaching, to young leaders from Finley High School to help them maximise their potential during final years at school and beyond. It also encourages students to focus on the local community and ways that they can work to improve it.

What's in it for coaches?

Max Potential draws on leaders within the community, business, industry, schools and churches, equipping them with progressive coaching skills and tools that apply across personal, life and employment contexts.

You will be given training in a life-coaching model which explores ten personal leadership principles and the opportunity to use these in practice with Max Potential participants, supported by your own Future Achievement Australia coach.

All coaches will have the opportunity to build coaching into a personal and professional leadership profile.

What's your commitment?

There are a few key dates, highlighted in the coach application form which you will need to be available for in order to participate in the program. You also need to commit to fortnightly coaching sessions with the young person(s) you will be coaching. These will be in the form of eight 60 minute coaching sessions. There will also be two 2 hour group meetings where your coachee(s) will get together with yourself and others in the program to discuss their progress. You will also be given four one hour coaching sessions with a Future Achievement Australia coach during the early part of the coaching process, with on going support via phone or email until the end of the program.
