Here we were against some of the best Poll Dorset studs and we were over the moon with our results. Our rams were placed fifth and seventh in a field of nine ewes. In the pairs class our ewes were placed third having been moved from fourth to be in front of Armdale; quite an achievement!

#### Shorthorn judging:

Devil, paraded by Jessica O'Leary, competed with five other bulls, three that were older than him, to take out Junior Champion Bull. He went on to out class the Senior Champion Bull and be crowned Grand Champion Bull.

#### **Education Tax Refund**

Eligible families can claim up to \$375 per primary school student and \$750 per secondary school student for legitimate educational expenses under the Education Tax Refund (ETR), but according to the Australian Tax Office (ATO) only half have lodged a claim, leaving more than \$500 million in unclaimed benefits.

So save those receipts. Taxpayers still have until March to April 2010 to claim out of pocket education expenses for the 2009 school year, if they lodge their individual tax returns through a tax agent.
