Motivational Media

The Motivational Media Roadshow comes to school this Friday. All students are encouraged to attend this sight and sound spectacular.

Motivational Media aims to both **challenge and inspire young people** to develop strategies that will enable them to reach their true potential so that their life choices will not be diminished through avoidable, reckless and harmful behaviours.

Motivational Media's programs make use of three large, panoramic screens, along with state of the art synchronised projectors, producing an image 13 metres wide. This is combined with amplified sound, current popular music and inspirational stories creating an experience that grips students' attention like no other program.

The package includes detailed follow-up material, including student worksheets which some teachers will use to promote discussion to raise student awareness of the importance of self esteem, wise decision making, goal setting and friendship choices.

Motivational Media focuses on young people preventing or controlling situations that may result in harmful behaviours.

Cost: \$2 payable at the Pay Office on or before the day.

We feel that it is so important for all students to attend this production, the school will subsidise the remaining cost for those who pay \$2.

Uniform

With winter now upon us, many coloured jumpers are starting to appear around the school. It is timely therefore to remind the school of the uniform requirements.

Students are expected to wear the full school uniform or bring a note if for some reason they are out of uniform.

Green woollen jumpers can be purchased from the school canteen or some students choose to wear the bottle green cotton jumpers which can be purchased from BIG W, Kmart etc. Make sure that jumpers are labelled with students name so if misplaced it can be returned.

Black leather covered in shoes are essential for practical lessons and black shoes are a part of the school uniform.

Girls should not be wearing leggings or track suit pants. The school uniform for girls is black trousers or jeans.

We encourage all students to wear the school uniform which has been agreed to by the parent body. Students who are out of uniform without a note are given a detention. Students who are regularly out of uniform or fail to attend detentions are placed on a Loss of Privileges list which prevents them from representing the school at excursions and other school events.

Mr Roebuck has been very supportive of the initiatives the school has in place regarding uniforms.
