Tips to succeed at high school

Careers Update

Class of 2014 University Update

This report only contains statistics for students applying for Tertiary study in Victoria. NSW data will be reported in due time. In the class of 2014 - 30 students applied for tertiary study in VIC. Of the 30 applicants, 28 (93.33%) were successful in receiving Round 1 offers. Of these offers 83.33% were made into Commonwealth Supported Places. The gender breakdown was 11 males and 17 females being made VTAC offers. The institutions included:-

Year 12 Melbourne Tertiary Tour



Swimming Carnival

The Finley High School Twilight Swimming Carnival takes place on Thursday the 12th of February, 2015. The students will go to class as normal for periods 1 to 4 and the first half of lunch, unless they have entered the longer distance races. At the commencement of the second half of lunch there will be a quick assembly and then students will be walked to the pool, supervised by teachers. The carnival is expected to finish at approximately 7.30pm with buses running to the town centres of Jerilderie, Berrigan and Tocumwal.

Each student needs to bring \$3 for pool entry or their Berrigan Shire season pass (to be shown on the day). Students are encouraged to wear their house colours for the entire day; however, clothing needs to be appropriate for school and suitable for any practical lessons, this includes fully enclosed footwear. It is advised that they also bring a hat, sunscreen and water bottles. Parents are welcome to come to the carnival and enjoy the activities. There will be a BBQ and kiosk selling food and drinks.

On Friday the 13th the school will not be operating for normal lessons; therefore, students are not required to attend. Should the carnival be washed out, normal lessons will be held on Thursday and Friday with the carnival being postponed to a later date.

Intereach Ability Links NSW


Ability Links is a new approach to supporting people with disability aged 9 to 64 years, their families and carers in their communities.
