#### **Principal's Report**

#### **Subject Selections**

Students across the school have been making subject selections for 2016. While we endeavour to give as many students as possible their choices, we are limited by our staffing. I am prepared to put more money in to guarantee a broader curriculum for Year Twelve and possibly Year Eleven, but students may still miss out on doing some of their preferred subjects. Having a "back up" plan is always crucial.

#### **Professional Learning**

All teachers stayed at school until 6:30pm on Tuesday evening to participate in professional learning activities. The Work Health and Safety Consultant talked to teachers via video link about the Employee Assistance Program. Mr O'Leary is leading a team to look at the school award system with the view to ensuring all students are recognised for their efforts and abilities on Formal Assemblies. In 2016, they will review the SCAN welfare system which has been in operation at Finley High School since 1998. Students and parents will be encouraged to give their input into this process.

The teachers then broke into different teams to look at how we can improve the culture and learning opportunities at Finley High School. Topics discussed included raising expectations across the school, evaluating and reviewing homework and assessment policy, implementing technology more effectively into senior classes, developing skills in improving writing responses of students and developing an effective program of study for Year Ten to better prepare them for studying in Year Eleven.

These teams have developed as a result from feedback from the whole school community about how we structure and organise learning in the senior school. They align very closely with the School Improvement Plan and we are looking forward to improving what we do here at Finley High School on a daily basis.

#### Year Twelve

Years Eleven and Twelve are busily preparing for their Trial HSC exams which commence next Friday 21<sup>st</sup> August. They are also starting to access online applications for university entry, accommodation and scholarships as well as various apprenticeships which have been advertised to students. All students should be actively engaging with their future now. There is a timeframe for these applications to be made and they will not be extended. I encourage all parents of Year Twelve students to talk about their plans for 2016 and beyond so that they are not disappointed in January when university offers are made.

A huge thank you must be extended to Mrs White who presented a thorough run down of how to apply for tertiary studies in both Victoria and NSW. Her dedication to our senior students and their future is outstanding and she did a fabulous job under extremely challenging circumstances. It was terrific that so many parents and students could come to that very important presentation. Thank you, Mrs White.

#### Invoices

We are well behind in parents paying subject contributions and school fees this year. Without parents meeting their responsibilities in this regard, we are limited in the types of activities we can offer students in some classes. Invoices will be sent again this week and I urge all parents to make their contribution to the school as soon as possible. 

**Shoes:** It is compulsory for all students to wear full leather school shoes. This rule is designed to give student's feet maximum protection and will be fully enforced.

**Hats:** It is strongly recommended that all students wear a hat when involved in outside activities such as PE, Sport, at the farm, or on any excursion or outside activity. School hats and caps are available to purchase from the canteen.

**Jackets:** Students are not to wear sporting jackets or 'hoodies'. Students are encouraged to wear a black school jacket in cold weather.

Parents will be contacted if students are continually out of uniform without a note from home. Students who do not follow the rules surrounding uniform procedures may be placed on Level 3.
