## **Principal's Report**

### Congratulations, Damon

Congratulations to Damon Anderson who has been accepted into the Honeywell Engineering Summer School at Sydney University. Damon was selected from students who applied around the state, to participate in this educational experience. He will enjoy learning in engineering lectures and practical workshops during the last week of term and will stay on campus at Macquarie University. Damon is excited about being able to experience university life first hand and to meet students from across NSW who have similar interests in Engineering as himself. The Finley Rotary Club is associated with this venture and it is through their interest in providing opportunities for our students that Damon will have this opportunity.

### **Professional Learning**

On Tuesday evening, the teachers at Finley High stayed behind at the end of the day to participate in an afternoon of professional learning. The areas covered for the day were Clickview Online, How2Learn, PBL and PDPs.

A representative from Clickview showed teachers how to access and make the most of this online resource that the school purchases each year to enrich the learning experiences of our students. Teachers learned about how to make videos on Clickview interactive and designed especially for the needs of the students in their classrooms.

How2Learn activities got teachers to reflect upon how they learn and how they can encourage students to do the same. By identifying areas of strength and weaknesses in how we learn, we are able to improve what we learn. A strategy of "split screen thinking" was explored as a way to explicitly teaching learning strategies in the classroom and methods of memory retention discussed.

The PBL team debriefed the staff on the three days of planning that has taken place over the past week and staff then had the opportunity to reflect on their own professional learning goals for the year.

I would like to thank Andrew Richardson and the Finley Bakery for donating some tasty, sweet treats for afternoon tea. We were very thankful for the generosity of the Finley Bakery and Andrew's generosity went a long way to making the teachers feel appreciated by the community. Thanks Andrew!

### **Outstanding Fees**

Unfortunately, the school still has over \$23 000 in outstanding school fees. I would like to encourage as many parents as possible to support the school by contributing what they can to the payment of their school fees before the end of the month when the school's financial year rolls over.

### Community P & C

Last night, I took the opportunity to report to the school community about our progress on the School Plan 2015-2017 and to outline our future directions for 2017. Parents were sent an invitation to attend last week and came along to listen, give feedback and ask questions. Thanks to the staff who came to support and present to parents.

### **Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA)**

Work began yesterday on the Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA) which will be built in the playground by the end of term. This COLA will provide shade and shelter for our students while also giving them space to play handball and have outdoor assemblies, meetings and lessons under cover. This COLA is being funded by a joint funding grant from the NSW state government who covers 50% of all the costs with the school meeting the other 50%. We look forward to using it fully in 2017.

### **HSC Exams completed**

The Higher School Certificate Exams finished with Chemistry last Thursday. The wait is now on for the results to come in. Several teachers have been and are currently marking the HSC in various subjects. This is fantastic professional learning for our teachers who gain real insights into what the examiners are looking for and how students can gain those extra few marks.

### Year Ten

Year Ten will commence their yearly examinations next week. The exams will start on Monday and finish on Thursday. The following week, these students will attend their second work experience placement for the year. This is a great opportunity to experience a workplace environment and to have a taste of the positives and negatives of working in their favoured career. I hope that all students in Year Ten find the lessons they learn during work experience to be valuable.

### **LMBR**

This week, Mrs Braine (SAM) and Mrs Close (Pay office) will be travelling to Deniliquin to begin their journey to switching the school over to LMBR which is a new management system for finances, resources and documentation. Along with me, they will undergo intensive training on the system for the first half of next year before our system "goes live" in July. This will mean a massive change to how we process data and payments at Finley High School. We will keep you well informed of how this may impact on our current procedures as we learn more.

### Local science winners could be on the path to world-saving discovery

Aspiring local science wizs have been told they could be the key to solving some of the world's future problems.

Thirty-one Riverina Year Eleven students were yesterday awarded Victor Chang School Science Awards for their excellent achievement and passion for science.

Local science wiz, Sophie Lostroh of Finley High School, was presented with her award by Victor Chang Cardiac Research Institute research scientist, Dr Christopher Stanley, at a Riverina presentation ceremony hosted by Junee High School.

Dr Stanley shared his journey in science from an inquisitive youngster tinkering with a chemistry set to his current role making discoveries "that nobody else in the world knows about yet".

He urged students to follow their passions and dreams of pursuing a career in science.

Dr Stanley revealed that he had discovered chemicals that impact on blood pressure in certain people.

"The best part of science is that it allows you to contribute newly discovered knowledge to the world," Dr Stanley said.

"It can make a difference in people's lives."

Executive Director Public School NSW Graham Kahabka congratulated the Victor Chang School Science Award recipients and urging them to continue to apply themselves to sustain their achievements so far.

"Science is the thing that will help us in the future," Mr Kahabka said.

"I'm sure some out of this group here will be people that will be solving our problems."

After hearing each of the award winners' citations read by Cootamundra network director Jenene McGrath, in his closing remarks Deniliquin network director Troy Mott concluded that each of the students had not only excelled in science but were all-round achievers and leaders.

# Country Women's Association of NSW – Murray Hut Branch STEM Scholarship

The STEM Scholarship is awarded to a female student in Year Twelve at Finley High School to commence tertiary studies in 2017 in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). This could include all the health sciences, agricultural sciences, animal sciences, computer technology, food technology, robotics, nursing, sports sciences, psychology as well as the more traditional STEM courses.

This scholarship is for a hardworking student with a passion in their chosen area of study and not necessarily the person with the best HSC results. All female students intending to study at TAFE or university in any of the STEM areas are encouraged to apply.

The scholarship is awarded in late December following the release of the HSC results and ATAR scores.

Applicants will be required to submit a written application and attend an interview in the week following the release of the HSC results and ATAR scores.

All written applications should be submitted to Principal of Finley High School.

The application should address the following criteria:

- 1. The STEM related course that you intend to study.
- 2. Why you want to study the particular course chosen.
- 3. How \$1000 will assist you in the first year of tertiary study?
- 4. What your future career aspirations may be post tertiary study?
- 5. Include a personal reference and final Year Twelve school report.
