Principal's Report

Swimming Carnival

Next Thursday, Finley High School will hold its annual Twilight Swimming Carnival.

Students will come to school and attend the first four lessons. Half way through lunch, the bell will ring and students will attend an assembly before walking to the pool. The carnival will commence around 2:30pm and will conclude at approximately 7:30pm. One bus per town will pick the students up from the pool and take them to the centre of each town. Local students can walk home or be picked up by their parents. Students are encouraged to come to school in their house colours but must wear covered in shoes while at school.

Because students have effectively stayed at school until 7:30pm, there will be no school on Friday 12th February.

Sport Years Eight to Eleven

We have made some changes to sport for **Years Eight to Eleven** this year in the hope that students become more involved in sport. There are a wider variety of options for sport, with many of them taking place outside of school. In Term One sport will be held Wednesday morning during periods one and two when it is cooler.

To avoid the clamour to get changed we will allow students to wear their sports clothes to school and remain in them for the day. Students who have practical lessons must however bring leather shoes to wear for classes in labs, kitchens and workshops.

Year Seven sport will be held in individual lessons throughout the timetable period. **Year Seven** students are required to wear their school uniform to school and change into their sports uniform at the beginning of their sport lesson, changing back into their school uniform after sport.

Swimming Carnival

The Finley High School twilight swimming carnival takes place on Thursday the 11th of February, 2016. The students will go to class as normal for periods 1 to 4 and the first half of lunch, unless they have entered the longer distance races. At the commencement of the second half of lunch there will be a quick assembly and then students will be walked to the pool, supervised by teachers. The carnival is expected to finish at approximately 7:30pm with buses running to the town centres of Jerilderie (near the lake – to be confirmed with bus company), Berrigan (Shire building) and Tocumwal (big fish).

Each student needs to bring \$3 for pool entry or their Berrigan Shire season pass (to be shown on the day). Students are encouraged to wear their house colours for the entire day; however, clothing needs to be appropriate for school and suitable for any practical lessons, this includes fully enclosed footwear. It is advised that they also bring a hat, sunscreen and water bottles. Parents are welcome to come to the carnival and enjoy the activities. There will be a BBQ and kiosk selling food and drinks.

On Friday the 12th the school will not be operating for normal lessons; therefore, students are not required to attend. Should the carnival be washed out, normal lessons will be held on Thursday and Friday with the carnival being postponed to a later date.

From here students will be invited to attend campus workshops at Charles Sturt University where they will have a chance to look around the campus as well as be involved in some workshops that showcase university style learning.

The year has started well with students being enthusiastic about their new classes and subjects. They have managed to get around the school successfully and have helped each other out when needed. By all reports the students have settled in well and are a lovely group to teach.

Expressions of Interest - Competition basketball





Swimming lessons and swimming carnivals

As the new school year has begun and swimming carnivals or swimming lessons will start shortly, I would like to remind you it is recommended that children who have had diarrhoea in the previous **2** weeks should avoid swimming pools.

Late in 2015 there was a sharp increase in cryptosporidiosis cases in NSW.

Many things can cause diarrhoeal illness and those who have been infected can still shed the causative agent, even after their diarrhoea has stopped. Parasites such as giardia and cryptosporidium are common and have been associated with outbreaks linked to public pools.

Please ensure parents and carers of your students are advised that if their child has had diarrhoea, they are to avoid swimming pools for 2 weeks after the diarrhoea has stopped. Feel free to distribute information via the link below:
