CHS Athletics

Last week, several students travelled to Sydney to participate in the NSW CHS Athletics Carnival.

School Fees and Subject Contributions

Lockdown

Each term we are required to have an evacuation or lockdown drill. This term we were scheduled to complete an evacuation drill. Due to the wet weather and the senior students having exams, we have been unable to have the drill this term.

Instead, next week, we will have a lockdown drill. Lockdown drills are important to practice in case of a danger that presents itself in the school playground such as a snake, an aggressive intruder etc.

The lockdown signal is an intermittent series of bells that will ring for two minutes. Teachers will lock the classroom doors, pull down the blinds and ask students to quietly get under the desks until the all clear signal is given.

As a parent, if you arrive at the school and hear the intermittent ringing of the bells, please do not enter the school grounds but return to your vehicle and leave the vicinity.

We would hope never to have a real lockdown, but we must have drills so that students and staff are aware of what to do in case of such an emergency.

We will move the evacuation drill to term 4.

On Tuesday evening, Year Twelve Music students gave a performance for family and friends to present their HSC practical musical items to an audience before their practical exams today. The performances they gave were inspiring and the friendships they have formed in that class between themselves and their teacher Miss Geeves was a wonderful sight to behold. National Self Detection of Scoliosis

It the time of the year when we remind parents and carers of girls in Years Seven and Nine to check for Scoliosis.

Scoliosis (or curvature of the spine) is an important health problem that twenty five girls per thousand are at risk of developing. Three girls per thousand require active treatment such as surgery or a spinal brace. Self-screening around the ages of eleven to thirteen is a sound preventative health measure.

When I went to school, the schools used to conduct the screening. In 2016, the Self-Detection Program is the alternative.
