As I write this, Year Ten are demonstrating the knowledge and skills they have learnt throughout the year in Science via the Yearly exam. For many, this week is a challenging time as they sit exams in PDHPE, Maths, Science, English and History as well as electives. I wish the students well and hope their efforts in class and at home study are justly rewarded.

In addition to curriculum at school, some of our students have been participating in extra-curricular activities with stunning results. The NSW Department of Education and Victor Chang Cardiac Research Institute have recognised Stephanie Harris for excellence in Year Eleven Science. Stephanie will travel to Junee tomorrow to receive her award at a special presentation ceremony.

Last week I had the honour of attending Deniliquin's Dramatic Minds Festival and watching Ms Wood's Year 9/10 Drama class perform a play they wrote themselves to raise awareness of mental health. Titled 'Words Matter', the play highlighted the impact negative communication with peers can have on individuals, and finished with sources of help such as teachers, peers, counsellors and parents. The students' performance was fantastic, and in my biased view, was the best at the festival. We thank Ms Wood and Jodi Brown for working with this talented group of students who represented Finley High School with pride.

Students aren't the only ones receiving accolades. Mrs White was nominated for outstanding Careers Adviser of the year, and travelled to Sydney last week for the announcement and presentation ceremony. We are thrilled to announce that Mrs White was selected the runner-up in this NSW state award. We are lucky to have her at Finley High School guiding our kids to prepare for and transition into life after high school.

Whilst our Year Twelve students finally finished the HSC exams this week, we currently have a number of teachers participating in HSC marking. This is a very valuable experience as it gives teachers the opportunity to view the full range of HSC answers from across the state as well as networking with other teachers to share ideas and resources. Those that participate return to school feeling the extra work was well worth it and our students definitely benefit from the experience.



teen Mental Health First Aid (tMHFA): What parents need to know

Your child's school is conducting tMHFA training, which gives teenagers the skills they need to recognise and help with mental health problems and crises in their friends, and to get the help of an adult quickly.

Young people will often turn to each other when stressed or upset, and try to help each other, taking too much on. This course teaches them not to try to take on these problems alone.

The course discusses suicide. You may wish to discuss this with your child, if there is a risk they will find it distressing.

This course has not been introduced because of any specific problems at the school. Mental health problems are very common in adolescents. If there has been a student suicide in the school, be aware this specific suicide will not be discussed, nor will any individual student.

Your child might want to talk about the course. The following can help you to have a conversation if this is needed.

Session 1 discusses mental health problems in general, and understanding how common and disabling these are in young people. Students also learn about professionals who can help.

Session 2 talks about helping a friend who is in crisis, whether because they are suicidal, engaging in non-suicidal self-injury, using alcohol or other drugs, or experiencing bullying or abuse.

The Action Plan ('Look, Ask, Listen, Help Your Friend') is introduced for the first time, and applied to a crisis situation. You can find details about the Action Plan on the MHFA website listed below.

There is a video which shows a young man helping a friend who is experiencing suicidal thoughts. Participants are told that in a crisis situation it is important to get a responsible adult involved right away.

Session 3 takes a step back and discusses how to help if someone seems to be developing a mental health problem. We don't teach students how to diagnose problems – it's advice about being a supportive friend, encouraging the friend to seek help, and knowing when it's time to get an adult involved.

Your child will bring their manual home after session 3. There are resources for further information in the back and you may want to explore them together. If you wish to learn more now, resources are also provided overleaf.
