Be involved

I cannot stress enough to all parents the importance of being involved with their child's secondary education.

Often, parents are very involved in their child's learning at primary school; but sadly, when students come to high school; many parents reduce their active participation in their child's learning.

During the teenage years, it can be sometimes difficult to stay connected to your children. Knowing what is going on at school, asking your child questions about what they are learning and, talking to teachers about your child's progress are just some of the ways you can support your child through these crucial years of learning.

Simple things can help you be connected to the school and have an understanding of what your child is learning and how they are learning it. Whether you are a working parent or a household manager, there are many things you can say and do to let your child know you are supporting their learning. Here are a few ideas.

- Help out on canteen (Phone Bernadette or Kaylene 5883 1105)
- Come to a P&C Meeting (Administration Building 7pm next Wednesday Feb 8)
- Ask students about what they learned today every day.
- Ask students what feedback they got today about their learning every day.
- Ask about the student's favourite class. Why is it their favourite?
- Ask students about events that are coming up? How are they going to be involved?
- Call the school and check on anything you are unsure about and discuss with your child.
- Call and speak to the Year Adviser about anything which may be impacting on the learning of your child
- Be positive about learning when you are speaking with your children
- Reinforce the values of PBL from Finley High School Responsible, Respectful Learning by using these words in your home and modelling these behaviours for your children
- Complete surveys as they are sent out and return them to school
- Complete permission notes in a timely manner and return them to school
- Pay for excursions, school contributions and fees when the invoices are distributed
- Discuss your child's report with them and find reasons to praise your child on their learning
- Communicate with the school about anything which may be concerning you

By working together as students, parents and teachers, we can achieve some great outcomes for all our students and students will feel confident in coming to school.

Hints and Tips No. 4: Good Attendance



There are a number of sound reasons for you to ensure that your child attends school regularly.

Firstly, attending school every day makes learning easier. For younger students, missing the basic skills often leads to learning problems later on and for older student's absenteeism often interferes with academic progress. Friendships with other students are also easier if your child attends school regularly.

The law in NSW states that all children between the ages of 6 and 15 years are required to attend school. Sickness or injury, attendance at a special religious ceremony or a serious family situation are satisfactory reasons for non-attendance. Please let the school know why your child is not at school and provide an explanation on your child's return to school.

Birthdays, haircuts, pension days, Mondays etc are not satisfactory reasons for absence from school. Also try whenever possible to arrange your holidays in school vacation times.

Going to school is important. It makes learning easier for your child and helps build and maintain friendships with other children.

- Keep your child home only when they are sick.
- Advise the school of any absence.
- See doctors and dentists after school times.

Friends are important.

- Show an interest in your child's friends
- Invite friends to come and play
- Encourage your child to play with other children.

Helping your child have a happy day at school is important for you and your child.

If you are having difficulties in getting your child to school you should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the problem and ask for help.

The principal may ask a Home School Liaison Officer to contact you for further assistance and advice.
