Close the Gap

On March the 16th SToMP supported the Close the Gap Campaign. The initiative aims to bring people together, to share information and most importantly, to take meaningful action in support of achieving Indigenous health equality by 2030.

Last year, more than 160 000 people took part in 1640 separate Close the Gap events across the country including Finley High School who submitted around 200 signatures in support of the campaign. With continued support from the public, we can ensure the Australian Government continues to work with Indigenous communities, commit additional funding and invest in real partnerships.

This year many staff and students took time out to sign the pledge during recess and lunch. SToMP put facts about the campaign in the daily notices during the week leading up to the event which increased awareness and understanding of their reasons behind supporting the pledge.





Generation Next Interactive Livestream

On March 17th 4 SToMP members had the opportunity to attend an interactive livestream from Generation Next. The workshop was about healthy technology use, stress and study and mental health. They heard from 3 professionals who work within the Mental Health sector.

After the workshop the team had the chance to brainstorm some of the ideas they could implement at Finley High to increase mental wellbeing. One idea that came up was the Year Twelve exams and how we could support the students. The SToMP group had learnt the importance of eating before an exam to kick start your brain functions for example a quick snack or breakfast. With the support of our Executive staff SToMP have decided to offer some bite size chocolates and fruit to our Year Twelve students before entering into some of their exams. They are also in the process of developing a support card which will have some stress less tips, support contacts and study information on them for future use.

IXL

The independent learning program that we have called IXL, has operated for our senior students throughout term 1. Student and staff feedback has been very positive about the program. I have been very impressed with our student's enhanced ability to plan the use of their time effectively and prioritise tasks so that they stay ahead of their work.

It was especially pleasing to see how effectively Year Twelve was using the available time between exams this week. They have certainly developed in their ability to focus on a task and achieve a goal.

The IXL centre received a lift this term with arrival of new modular furniture. This has given the space a fresh modern feel. It has certainly transformed the learning space and made it more versatile.

During term 2, senior students will be interviewed by their year advisor to discuss their goals and how we can all work together to help them achieve them. Students who are experiencing some difficulty in any subject will have a discussion about how we improve their outcomes in that subject and how they can best utilise their IXL time.

BYOD at Finley High School

Advances in technology have led to massive changes in the way we work, our recreation and the way that we learn. There are tremendous learning tools available to classroom teachers if all students are able to access a computer. NAPLAN and VALID are two nationwide assessments that all students sit in Years Seven, Eight and Nine. These will all be online tests from 2018. Students will be able to use their own device when completing these tests, which would be an advantage to them as they are using a familiar machine.

With these changes to our world it is essential that students are familiar with the use of computers and utilise them in the classroom. At Finley High School we have a BYOD policy so that the students are able to have access to the latest advances in education in classrooms. We are able to loan out a small number of older laptops to students who are unable to access their own. It is preferable that students have their own laptop to use.

The school has purchased laptop lockers for the students to store their laptops (and any other gear) when it is not required, such as during sport lessons. These lockers will help ensure that laptops are kept safe. There are several Key Learning Areas that would like to increase their use of technology in the classroom and enable the students to advance at rates that reflect their ability. This will happen if more students are bringing their laptops to school.

We have noticed a significant drop off in the number of students bringing their laptop and an increased reliance on using a school device. This unfortunately has led to many occasions where we do not have enough laptops, so the lesson had to be abandoned or students had to share a computer which is not ideal.

I encourage all students to bring their device to school or to purchase one. The more students who have a device at school, the greater the use will be in the classroom. Please remember that if you purchase a laptop you do not need to buy any software. The Microsoft package is provided free through the Department.

The Future of Jobs

There is concern among students and parents that job losses through robotics, artificial intelligence and technology is creating uncertainty about future employment.

There's no question that technology will impact on future jobs and employment. Some jobs will disappear and new ones will be created. In fact there is evidence to suggest that there will be a net gain of jobs with 82% of companies saying they are likely to hire more people in the future. We can substantiate this by the fact that the top three countries with the highest number of robots and automation - Japan, South Korea and Germany - have the lowest unemployment.

The technology revolution is here!

While most jobs will be impacted by technology it doesn't mean they will disappear. They won't go ... they'll change. The choice is not Man or Machine but rather Man plus Machine. New technologies will make us smarter, more productive and faster at achieving outcomes. We are in a 'technology revolution'.

The difference today compared to previous revolutions, is the speed at which things are occurring. This makes it difficult for employers to predict beyond the next few years exactly what they'll need and who to employ.

So where does this leave students and job seekers.

There is going to be a skills gap and a transition period for a number of years as we figure out how best to use new technologies and the skills required. We don't really know exactly what these new skills will be but what we do know is that STEM and technology subjects will form an integral part of almost everything we do.

Being digitally smart is going to be a big advantage for future jobs seekers. Because of rapid change, everyone will be on a continuing learning curve as they transition through their working life. Those that don't want to learn new technologies will be left behind and a person's 'learnability' will determine their success.


Our best advice
