Principal's Report

Welcome back to Term Two.

This term is shaping up to be a huge term. Athletics carnival, cross country carnival, NAPLAN, Year Eleven Half-Yearly Exams, Parent/Teacher Evening, school reports, MADDD Night and an information evening for Year 6 students and parents.

State and National Swimming

At the end of last term, three students travelled to Sydney to compete in the Combined High Schools State Swimming carnival. Tom Burton, Zac Sartore and Sascha Jones represented Finley High School in the Riverina team. All three of our students achieved outstanding times with Tom Burton taking a massive 20.22 seconds off his entry time in the multiclass 50m backstroke and Sascha Jones achieving a stunning 4th in the 100m backstroke. This is an amazing achievement from Sascha who completes much of her training with the Finley Swimming Club in our local 25m pool. Sascha has been selected to represent NSW at the all schools championships in Sydney on May 12th. We wish her our absolute best wishes.

In the holidays, Sascha also competed in the National Age Swimming Championships in Brisbane. She swam PBs in her lead up events and finally placed 8th in Australia and 10th overall against international competitors in the 100m backstroke event We could not be more proud of Sascha. Her commitment and dedication to her sport has well and truly paid off. Great effort, Sascha!

Youth Day

Youth Day was held on the last day of Term One. Students dressed in the colours of the rainbow and participated in some fun-filled activities throughout the afternoon. I congratulate the SRC on their impressive organisation of the day and positive commitment to the school by organising this day for our Finley High School students.

NSW Premiers ANZAC Memorial Scholarship

Zac Barlow has won the NSW Premiers ANZAC Memorial Scholarship. Finley High School was one of hundreds of schools from across the state who applied to participate in the ballot for this major event! Our school was selected as one of the twenty two schools to send representatives to the Western Front on this government sponsored trip.

Nine students from Years Ten and Eleven submitted artefacts which commemorated the history of our war heroes on the Western Front during WWI. They each supported their application with an interview with a panel consisting of Paul Jones (P&C President), Ryan Lock (Finley RSL Sub Branch) and me. All applications were outstanding.

Zac's interview and speech reflected his passion for history and his desire to learn more about those diggers from WWI. Zac will travel to the Western Front in Europe in the September school holidays.

ANZAC Day

Tuesday's ANZAC services were well attended by our students. I felt so proud marching with the students of Finley High School. Through the rain in Berrigan, drizzle in Jerilderie and the sunshine in Finley, all students looked great and were exceptionally respectful of each other, others in the community and to the memory of our diggers.

At the Finley service, Zac Barlow read his essay on the ANZACs to the community. Lauren Clarke and Fraser Taig read prayers and several other students assisted the RSL Club in bearing flags and banners in the march. Almost 100 students attended either the Dawn Service or the 11 am service in Finley to represent the school.

After the Finley march, seven of our nine students who applied for the Premier's ANZAC Scholarship went to the RS Club for the unveiling of a plaque for the Lone Pine before moving into the auditorium to speak informally to local residents about the artefacts they made for their application. I would like to thank Stephanie Harris, Eloise Ashley-Cooper, Zac Barlow, Emma Marsden, Isabella Jackson, Hayley Gow and Georgia Webb for giving their time for this event.

In Jerilderie, Paige Nash and Kiara Keating represented the school as flag bearers for the town. Thirty Finley High School students braved the weather to pay their respects to local heroes.

In Berrigan, where the rain was steady as we marched to the hall, the ten students who represented the school did so with the utmost respect, led by Zeke Carruthers and Lauren Clarke. Tom Whelan spoke to the Berrigan community about his family's history in past conflicts.

In Tocumwal, Hannah Heaney, Piper Hicks and Rose Chamberlain played their part to represent Finley High School in their local ANZAC service. Each read a prayer and they led the students of Finley High School before laying the wreath.

Yesterday, the Year 9/10 World History class led the school in its own commemoration of ANZAC Day. The program they presented allowed us to reflect on the poor conditions in which our diggers found themselves on the Western Front. It was a moving tribute and I congratulate them on their efforts to present this to the school.

New staff

This term we welcome some new staff to the school.

Miss Infanti has joined the Special Education and Support faculty, replacing Ms Stratton who has moved to Melbourne.

Mrs Marsden and Miss Coates will fill in for Miss Ritchie in teaching Science and will be replaced in their support roles by Miss Parker.

Congratulations Georgia Webb

Georgia Webb has been selected as one of twenty four students from across Victoria and southern NSW to complete her Year Ten Work Experience with Herald Weekly Times in Melbourne. Georgia was one of several hundred students who submitted a detailed application to the newspaper. Georgia is to be congratulated on her dedication to achieving her best at all times and I know she is thrilled to have this opportunity to develop an insight into journalism in Melbourne, when she attends work experience in Week 3 of next term.

Additional notes -

- ❖ Shoes It is compulsory for all students to wear full leather school shoes. This rule is designed to give student's feet maximum protection and will be fully enforced. See over page.
- ❖ Hats -It is strongly recommended that all students wear a hat when involved in outside activities such as PE, Sport, at the farm, or on any excursion or outside activity. School hats can be purchased from the canteen for \$15. They include reversible bucket hats or baseball caps.
- ❖ Jackets –Students are not to wear sporting jackets or 'hoodies'. Students are encouraged to wear the black jacket in cold weather.

Finley High School Footwear

The school expects students to follow Department of Education and Training Policy and the Workplace Health and Safety Act 2000, and the determination of its own WHS committee by wearing *enclosed leather, lace-up, buckle or Velcro fastened shoes*. They *must cover the whole top of the foot* and have a low heel. *Students must not wear skate shoes, black soft ballet style shoes, open top Mary-Jane shoes, canvas/synthetic or similar material type shoes*. If you are not sure what footwear is acceptable then please consult the school before buying new shoes. A salesperson at a shoe shop will NOT necessarily give you the correct advice in terms of approved school styles. Please check with the school.

These styles of shoes are <u>ACCEPTABLE FOOTWEAR</u>—they are all black, they cover the whole top of the foot and they are all leather-



These styles of shoes are <u>UNACCEPTABLE FOOTWEAR</u> – they are either made of canvas, or are synthetic and/or they do not cover the whole top of the foot, have 'holes' in the top of the foot, and /or they are not black-



Note - students who may have a medical condition that requires them to have special footwear should produce a statement from their doctor to that effect.

Corridors of Connection ~ Places of the Billabong Creek

For those of us living along the Billabong Creek, we're very pleased to learn that Murray Local Land Services is funding a photographic essay to capture the great diversity of places and spaces along our vital and unique creek.

My name is Helene Mortlock and my family own a small but much-loved place alongside the Billabong Creek in Jerilderie. I also run Jumptree Studios, a local organisation supporting The Billabong Creek by building places, initiatives and networks that promote sustainable futures for us all.

Murray Local Land Services is funding Jumptree Studios to create a photographic essay featuring 20 different places that have connection to The Billabong Creek. The images will be part of an online gallery and will be featured in an exhibition in late 2017 to which all participants and communities along the Billabong Creek will be invited.

Would you like to share your place on the creek?

The Billabong Creek is the longest creek on earth, winding its way from the foothills of the Great Dividing Range to the plains of southern central New South Wales. For this essay, we seek 20 properties/places (private or crown) located anywhere along the creek, from Walbundrie in the east to Moulamein in the west. It may be your place, or you may like to encourage family, friends or neighbours to share their connection to the Creek.

Our aim is to capture in images and anecdotes the essence of the Places of the Creek. It could be a place you live, or your ancestors lived. A place you farm, camp, fish, drove, built a cubby house, swim, pump water from, farm, water livestock or garden, because the creek and its waters are present.
