Bendigo Sheep Show 2017

We were thrilled to have our best ever results at the Bendigo Sheep Show this year. Each year the standard of our sheep improve as we exhibit in the extremely strong Poll Dorset section. Hamish Congdon, Isaac Arnold, Deklon Rafferty, Oliver Knight and Alexander A'Vard did a fantastic job parading the sheep.

Once again we won the Aggregate Novice Breeder trophy with two firsts, two seconds and a third from three classes. Our novice ram moved into the open class where he was awarded sixth place, a terrific result from the largest Poll Dorset class in the show. In the ram section we also received a fifth and sixth place. The highlight was winning first place with our ram lamb, an outstanding result. Our other ram lamb was also highly placed in fourth place. The ewes had a hard act to follow, but we received a fourth in the pairs of ewes and in the lamb class fifth and sixth with our two ewe lambs.

In the school interbreed section we didn't fare as well with the judge leaning toward other breeds, but our ewe was awarded third place. We are extremely proud of our results, not possible without the support of our breeding program by Genstock at Jerilderie and the Frost family of "Hillden" stud at Bannister near Goulburn. We look forward to the spring show season now, as we will be present at most of the regional shows.

School travel update

Application information - June 2017

Information for parents, guardians and students

Our school has partnered with Transport for NSW to use the new online School Portal for endorsing school travel applications and submitting School Drive Subsidy and Private Vehicle Conveyance Scheme attendance checks.

You are now able to manage all your school travel needs online including applying for school travel passes, tracking the status of your application and tracking the status of your School Drive Subsidy application and payments.

The application process has also been simplified so that a new or updated application for school travel passes is only needed when a student is:

- applying for a school travel pass for the first time
- requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).
- changing school or campus
- · changing home address
- receiving an expiry notification
- repeating a school year
- changing their name
- requesting a new transport operator.

This means students who are progressing to year 3 and year 7 only need to reapply if they are changing circumstances.

Students who are not residents and are temporarily in Australia can also provide their visa subclass number or exchange program when applying online, making the application and approval process much faster.
