Principal's Report

During that time I travelled the world in the Navy and then into teaching at Northmead, Chatswood, Crookwell and Condobolin High Schools. This week I have been overwhelmed by the warm welcome I have received from parents, students and the staff. I have been impressed by the friendliness and maturity of many of the students who have introduced themselves and told me about why they enjoy being here. I am committed to providing all students, regardless of their academic talents, with the opportunity to succeed. Tell Them From Me Reminder

The *Tell Them From Me* parent survey

Our school is participating in the **Partners in Learning parent survey**. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Blue Day

To conclude Term 3 our Student Team on Mental Positivity (SToMP) ran activities for Blue Day which supports Mental Health Month by promoting positive mental wellbeing. Blue Day aims to raise awareness and remove the stigma associated with mental health. The activities ran by past and present SToMP members for the student body included Kahoot, team building puzzles, informational videos and self-positivity posters.

Kahoot

This involved questions around mental health statistics as well as places in the school where you can get help, and who can provide it. It also bettered the students understanding of severe impact that mental illnesses can have on their peers.

Informational Videos

These videos clarified students understanding of stigma and its effects in preventing people from speaking out and getting the help they need

Self-Positivity Posters

Students were encouraged to think about themselves and to write down their strengths, their future aspirations, their favourite things and also what makes them who they are in a creative fashion. Once students completed this, we displayed them on the walls of the hall to show case all of our wonderful individualities

Puzzles

This team building activity aimed to form bonds between the students and improve their confidence within their groups. It also helped them work in a team and be inclusive to all. They did this through a puzzle relay activity.

Students and staff were all encouraged to wear blue to support this cause. There were prizes for best dressed. The lucky winners were Abi Litchfield, Sascha Jones, Jemma Coombs and Jalen Rogan. At lunch time SToMP held a BBQ and sold cupcakes and drinks. The funds raised will go towards future SToMP initiatives. The team also had music playing, skipping ropes and hula hoops out at lunch time. It was fantastic to see everyone out there having fun.

School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) 2019 Applications Now Open

School student applications for 2019 are now open.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 **do not** need to re-apply if they:

- Are continuing at the same school
- Are residing at the same address
- Have not been send an expiry notification from Transport NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator. NOTE: Some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students should check with their operator for more information.

Keep reading for a quick overview of the key sections of the app.


A guide to the new SkoolBag App

School Profile


From here you can access General Content by Category, Groups and eForms (Absentee & Permissions etc.).

Days with events have dots. Click on an event card to see details and add to your personal Calendar.





THE SAFE DRIVER COURSE INVOLVES TWO MODULES

MODULE ONE:

A 3 HOUR FACILITATED GROUP DISCUSSION ON HOW TO MANAGE RISKS ON THE ROAD. THIS WILL INVOLVE A MAXIMUM OF 12 PARTICIPANTS AND WILL BE DELIVERED BY A FACILITATOR.

MODULE TWO:

A 2 HOUR IN VEHICLE COACHING SESSION TO DEVELOP LOW RISK DRIVING STRATEGIES. THIS WILL INVOLVE 2 PARTICIPANTS AND A COACH.

COURSE COST: \$140

PARTICIPANTS MUST HAVE COMPLETED 50 HOURS OF ACTUAL ON ROAD DRIVING EXPERIENCE TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE COURSE. CREDITS GAINED UNDER THE 3-FOR-1 SCHEME CANNOT BE INCLUDED.

LEARNER DRIVERS WHO COMPLETED THE COURSE WILL RECEIVE 20 HOURS OFF THEIR LOG BOOK.
