On Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> June Year Twelve students participated in an interactive Zoom meeting with Charles Sturt University (CSU). Finley High School would normally host CSU for a face to face chat but under the current conditions we were using the next best option.

Students watched some videos of the various campuses of CSU made from both the ground level and via a drone in order to see the layout of campuses. They talked through the various alternative entry programs for ATSI students and options for those who miss the ATAR requirements. Students were also provided with tips and hints for completing the CSU Advantage applications for early entry. Finally, students had an opportunity to post questions on their phones and participate in a poll questionnaire. The session was extremely informative and very valuable for those currently applying for CSU courses for next year.

# HSIE – Year Eight History

In our last week of studying ancient Egypt year eight worked on creating their own cartouche. A cartouche is an oval shaped clay plaque that was placed on a pharaohs coffin with their name, written in hieroglyphics, etched into it.

Firstly Year Eight worked on understanding the hieroglyphic alphabet and then writing their own name, using the symbols, into their workbook. Once they 'graduated' from this they used playdoh and clay to create their own cartouche.
