THE BURN

A dystopian narrative by Charlotte Hurlston (9B)

During the online learning period this year, Year 9 students wrote dystopian narratives to demonstrate their understanding of the 'Dystopian Worlds' unit studied in English throughout Term 3. To showcase some of the excellent stories received, the English Faculty wish to share some of these with you all...

The sharp crack of the blinds snapping shut wakes me. I shoot upright and blink away the tears blurring my sight. When I alleviate my panic and draw my breathing to a controlled pattern, I attempt to suppress the nightmare I have just experienced. These nightmares have been happening for weeks; unexplainable sights that leave me filled with dread. Whilst these nightmares scare me, the thought of The Majority finding out about my defective thoughts causes an intense fear to ripple throughout me.

I dress in an all-white bodysuit with a thick zip down the front and grey sections running down the sides, from my wrists to my ankles. I twist my face into a generic smile, acting fulfilled, and present this facade to my fellow Accepts and The Majority.

I glide across the cream, marble floor and take my place in a pod and begin work. The assured safety of the glass pod brings me peace. I lean back, the pod moving as I am until I reach a horizontal position. My hands find the familiar touchpads and I begin, rapidly moving my fingers.

As the morning blurs into the afternoon, I leave the pod and swiftly sweep into the common room where A7 and A63 are waiting for me. I greet them and we break into a hushed banter, cut short by an announcement from The Majority who appear on the television screens above us. They bring to attention the restlessness of the Excepts and the caution we must take to ensure the safety of Accepts and the prevention of an invasion from their world. The Majority drone on about problems which do not apply to me. I block the monotone rambling until an unfamiliar, severe silence replaces it. The Minority. A single monstrous woman stands before us, her shoulders wide and masculine, her legs large and long. Her expressionless stare creates an icy atmosphere, the silence broken with a hoarse bellow.

"It has been indicated that defective thoughts have been detected within the Accepts." Every word is pronounced with extreme clarity. Every word amplifies my fear.

My chest has a panicked pressure. My breathing becomes quick and shallow. My head spirals out of control. I keep my physical composure, imitating the mass of confused looks, attempting to control the chaotic emotions inside. Five of The Majority march down two sets of thick, metal staircases. They reach my table and surround it. Heat rises into my face and a harsh dizziness overcomes me. I plaster a sure look upon my face, hiding my intimidation from one of The Majority's faces, possessed with a steely glare. I brace myself for whatever is to come...

Relief floods my body as my muscles fall limp from the adrenaline previously rushing through me. The man opposite me – A88 – is in the clutches of The Majority. Not able to mask his resentment, he resists and violently thrashes about. The rest of us are dismissed and advised to move away with haste.

As I break into a brisk walk, I skim my eyes around the dome above me, the tall white dome protecting us from the outside burn, a light so powerful it destroys everything. Apparently the Excepts treated our natural world so poorly that the barrier protecting us from the outside burn broke down, leaving us unprotected. The thoughtless actions of the Excepts drove us into hiding from the outside burn as only they could survive it.

I ponder for a moment: what would the outside burn do to an Accept. Melt us? Set us on fire? Or would it just instantly dissolve us, remove us? I silently chastise myself for the thoughts, for allowing myself to delve into curiosity, for -

"They are already here! You can't hide!" The man being hauled out by The Majority screams with an uneasy certainty.

My attention is broken from my thoughts and I stare into the eyes of the man, his emotion filled eyes give me a sense of danger, a thrilling feeling of risk that I am familiar with. I unintentionally edge toward him. Guilt starts to consume me but this is soon overruled by the immense curiosity flourishing inside me. I move towards him with a newfound courage, then the lights covering the dome flicker.

A disturbing, mocking laugh, escapes the man's throat and I stop dead in my tracks, watching in terror as a large crack forms in the top of the dome and creeps closer and closer to the floor. The whole room falls silent and a chilling suspense floods the room as the crack lines spread quickly across the entire dome.

Light suddenly surges through the fractured ceiling and the piercing screams leave me paralysed. I watch as Accepts desperately scramble to shade, and those who are touched by the burn are turned to an ashy black dust. Distraught Accepts who have found safety stare at me with an immense fear and begin to point; they point with accusation, disgust. Still in absolute shock I skim my eyes desperately from person to person when a wave of realisation crashes over me. I'm an Except, the burn doesn't affect me. I look at my hands trailing up to my arms then down to

my legs. Tears sting my eyes and a gasp escapes me. My skin is different – it's now a deep brown. The colour must have been masked by the lights in the dome.

I spot the man who was taken. He tumbles down the rubble and flees, his skin dark like mine. Suddenly, a flight craft emerges from the remains of the dome, and in it, The Minority. The threatening woman hurls toward me, knocking me off my feet but the impact spins her out of control. Adrenaline re-enters my body, I rapidly push myself to my feet and clamber over the dome's rubble, then break into a sprint. The desperation to escape, to live, overcomes me so I run further into the Excepts world.

The man taken by The Majority appears ahead of me. He has slowed to a walk and his breathing becomes louder and heavier as I near him. I startle him but he soon relaxes, laughing and sweeping his hand over my shoulder.

"I'm Max. And you're free."

My mind is overwhelmed with thoughts: The rapid escalation of the previous events has left me baffled, and how this Max man is so calm is beyond me. I span my vision across the vast sight before me, taken aback by intense familiarity. My mind's racing stops and is replaced with my now peaceful nightmare – a dream. The dream was this view: a wide, vibrant green blanket covering the ground, an expanse of iridescent colours, stealing my full attention. This was my world, and my mind knew all along.
