All visitors to the school must sign in. If you are attending the uniform shop located in the school canteen, please enter via the front office and sign in as required.



### Literacy

### **Literacy Goals**

The improvement of literacy, especially reading, is one of our school's main targets. We are focused on helping every student improve every day, in every subject. A number of projects have been or are in the process of being undertaken so that students become better readers, meaning that they have an improved level of understanding of what they read across the school curriculum. Knowledge of basic punctuation is essential. To help this, at the end of last year, some Year 8 students created ten literacy posters for every classroom so that teachers and students would always have a resource to use so that their use of capital letters and various sentence structures continue to develop.







An extension reading group was created for Year 9 students. They were chosen using Year 7 Naplan data and the aim is to extend these students so that we reach our target of having more students in the top bands. The selected students were band 9, 8 or the top of band 7 in the Year 7 Naplan test. They will have one lesson a fortnight and the first one was last week. These students enjoyed learning about the origins of words.

Community support is essential for these programs to have maximum impact. How can you help? Please encourage your child/children to read. It does not have to be a long novel to be useful. Reading anything is helpful – comics, graphic novels, football cards, advertisements, your shopping list...

Encouraging them to improve their vocabulary would also be extremely helpful. Make a game of it. It's easy to find new words with the help of a computer or dictionary. They can access a word of the day on a computer or their phones. Ask them about the new words they have been learning in different subjects at school. Talking about them helps cement understanding. In addition, all students have a login to Education Perfect and there are many activities on this online platform that extend vocabulary.

Please encourage your child to aim for continual improvement and excellence because that is what his/her teachers are aiming to do every day.



### NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

In 2021 the following vaccines will be offered:

YEARS	VACCINE	NUMBER OF DOSES
Year 7	Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine	2-doses at least 6 months apart
	Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine	Single dose
Years 10	Meningococcal ACWY vaccine	Single dose

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided
- complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
- return the completed consent form to their child's school
- ensure that their child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Please note that, to improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses during Year 7 or 8 (for HPV and dTpg vaccination) and during Year 10 or 11 (for Meningococcal ACWY vaccination) or consent signed in 2020.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/ Pages/withdraw consent.aspx.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at the time of vaccination. Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference. Details about vaccinations given at school will also be uploaded to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) to support complete vaccination histories.
