A word from Mr Ward

This week we acknowledge National Sorry Day on the 26th May and National Reconciliation week starting on the 27th May.

Observed annually on 26th May, National Sorry Day remembers and acknowledges the mistreatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who were forcibly removed from their families and communities, which we now know as 'The Stolen Generations'. National Sorry Day is a day to acknowledge the strength of stolen generations survivors and reflect on how we can all play a part in the healing process for our people and nation.

National Reconciliation theme for 2021 is "More Than a Word". Reconciliation is a journey for all Australians – as individuals, families, communities, organisations and importantly as a nation. At the heart of this journey are relationships between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. We all have a role to play when it comes to reconciliation and in playing our part, we collectively build relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories, cultures, and futures. Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

This long-running transition Expo is the only event of its kind in the State, attracting over 150 local, state and interstate exhibitors including leading education and training providers. The event connects young people with disability and their families to employment services, employers, education/training providers, apprenticeship/traineeship services, disability providers and government services to help them make informed decisions about their future and highlight the support that is available.

The Expo footprint is regional, rural and remote NSW and ACT:

You may not think of yourself as having a 'disability' but the definition is broad and includes learning disability, Autism Spectrum Disorder, medical conditions, mental illness, physical conditions, sensory impairments, intellectual disability and more.


