
Apex Club of Jerilderie – Working Dog Auction

Parent Teacher Interviews 2022

Welcome to Finley High School Parent Teacher interviews for Term 1 2022.

Interviews will be held on **Wed 6th April** in the Finley High School Hall from **4:00-6:30pm** for all year groups 7 to 12.

Bookings can be made through the Sentral Parent Portal. *Bookings will be open from 8:00am on the 28 March and close at 9:00pm on the 3 April 2022.*

To do this open your Sentral parent portal and click on the interview tab.

This will open the available interview options for your child or children. Select your child that you would like to make bookings for and then select the available bookings. Keep in mind the black time slots are available spaces, where as the greyed out ones are unavailable. Please note some staff are not available on the night due to other commitments. Interviews cans be arranged with these staff at another time if requested.

You will notice there is a time out banner at the top of the page. This shows how long you have left to finalise your bookings. This is to allow all families a fair opportunity to access bookings and time slots. At the completion of your booking you will see a listing of the bookings made. That is the teachers and times.

If you do not have access to the parent portal you can manually make bookings using the booking form. To do this your child needs to collect a booking sheet from their year adviser. This sheet must be signed by a parent or carer before any bookings can be made. The student then takes the sheet around to the necessary teachers who will make your booking and record it on your booking sheet. Should you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact the school.







Melbourne Food Expo Excursion


The Year 11 and 12 Hospitality classes left Finley early on Tuesday 1st March to attend the Foodservice Australia Expo in Melbourne.

REMINDER FOR BUS STUDENTS:

- School buses are considered public transport.
