A word from Mr Ward

This week marks the end of Week 6. With only four weeks to go, I feel the rush to get everything done before the end of the year. This is an opportunity for staff to upskill, plan and collaborate with their colleagues to ensure we are meeting the learning needs of all our students.

Student Behaviour Policy

This week I travelled to Wagga to engage with 200 other principals on the revised Student Behaviour Policy. The NSW Department of Education is introducing a revised Student Behaviour Policy and new Suspension and Expulsion Procedures from Term 1, 2024. The policy and procedures support an inclusive and safe learning environment for your child, staff and every child in NSW public schools. With the revisions to the policy, we now have clarity and consistency of how we manage disruptive and challenging student behaviour in the classroom, so our teachers can teach, and our students can learn. When developing individual plans, the guidelines allow us to work closer together with you to support your child to behave positively and respectfully with clear expectations, so they can achieve their best. We have many practices in place to help our students engage respectfully with each other and their

learning. You can find out more about these and access advice and support strategies to help you work with us to achieve positive outcomes for your child through the Department's Behaviour Support Toolkit. Violence in our schools is never acceptable. Suspension is a critical safeguard for ensuring the safety of our students, teachers and staff. You can read a preview of the policy and procedures on the Department website.

Included in this newsletter is a copy of the *Behaviour Code for students*. It is important that staff, parents and students understand this document and what we expect from every student at our school.

Remembrance Day

It was wonderful to see our school leaders in uniform, along with Sophie O'Donnell in her Girl Guides uniform at the local Remembrance Day service in Finley. Several of our staff were also present as we stopped to remember all those who gave their lives or served our country. Special thank you also to those who recently purchased a pin or pen to support the 'Poppy Appeal'. The money raised helps support serving and ex serving men and women who have suffered or continued to suffer from their service.

Movember

You may have noticed some staff and students doing their best to grow a moustache this month as we raise the awareness of men's health issues by recognising 'Movember'. Men are less likely to talk about their health or act on health concerns, a growing number of men – around 11 million globally are facing life with a prostate cancer diagnosis. Globally, testicular cancer is the most common cancer among young men. And across the world, one man dies by suicide every minute of every day, with males accounting for 69% of all suicides. So, to all of us, speak up, don't be afraid to talk about your health concerns and remember to check in on our friends and family. Thank you to everyone supporting this initiative, we look forward to checking in on those moustaches at the end of November.

The TAFE instructors gave glowing feedback on our wonderful students; they were a delight to train.



NSW Department of Education

Behaviour code for students

Information for students and parents or carers

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive, and responsive learning environments for everyone across a range of settings. We teach and model the inclusive and safe behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected, to the best of their ability, to:

- show respect to other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- · strive for the highest standards in learning
- act in a courteous and respectful way that makes all members of the school community feel valued, included and supported
- resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- meet the school's agreed uniform policy or dress code
- attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- respect all property
- be safe and not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, vapes,
 e-cigarettes or tobacco into our schools
- not bully, harass, intimidate, or discriminate against anyone in our schools.

Schools take action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high-quality teaching and learning.

All students have a right to:

- safety at school
- access and fully participate in their learning
- be treated with respect by other students, teachers and school staff
- express their views, set goals and selfadvocate.

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments and apply an appropriate action when students are not meeting these expectations. The department is responsible for the provision of a policy framework and resources such as legal issues bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context, the NSW

Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

Behaviour code for students: Student actions

Promoting the inclusion, learning, wellbeing, and safety of all students in NSW public schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches across a range of settings to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

To meet the expectations set out above, students in NSW public schools, to the best of their ability, should adhere to the following principles.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity.
- Communicate and behave courteously.
- Act and work cooperatively with other students, teachers, and school staff.
- Develop positive and respectful relationships.
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others.
- Respect the learning needs of other students.
- Dress appropriately by wearing the agreed school uniform or dress code.
- Take care with school property and the property of staff and other students.

Safety

- Model and follow school and class rules and expectations around behaviour and conduct.
- Negotiate and resolve conflict.
- Be aware of and take responsibility for how their behaviour and actions impact others.
- Care for self and others.
- Be safe and help others to make safe choices that do not hurt themselves or others.

Engagement

- Arrive at school and class on time.
- Be prepared for every lesson.
- · Actively participate in learning.
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning.
