Year Ten History

Students were asked to consider why a gas attack gave four casualties' but going 'over the top' resulted in more casualties for the attacker than defenders

Year Eleven Geography

On Monday afternoon 27th February, as a part of their studies about the hydrosphere and to prepare for an upcoming field trip, Year Eleven Geography headed to the lake to take some samples and test the water quality. In particular, they used turbidity tubes to measure the turbidity of the water, measured in Nephelometric Turbidity Units. They used universal indicator paper to measure the pH of the water. Additionally, the students used Geographic Information Systems to record location data and cameras to survey the location for further analysis.

The students worked incredibly well as a team and delegated roles accordingly to gather data from two locations.





1. Go to the Sentral Parent Portal




Year Eight English – 3D Modelling
